**COVID-19 Status Report  
Oak Park Village Board of Trustees**

To: Village President and Village Board of Trustees

The memo is a means to share a brief summary of information regarding Village of Oak Park operational activities in response to COVID-19. In most cases, formal public guidance or employee guidance has been publicly disseminated via the Village website or Village social media channels.

**New Public Health Guidance**

Today, the Village of Oak Park Department of Public Health received notification of the following new COVID-19 cases:

Excluding individuals for which street addresses are not yet determined, the State of Illinois reports a total of two thousand two hundred and twenty-seven (2227) Oak Park COVID-19 cases. It is important to note that as patient tracking and case follow-up occurs, individuals listing the number of Oak Park cases reported may change depending on residency confirmation.

The Oak Park Department of Public Health is notified of positive tests as established by state and local public health protocol. Because of privacy laws, no additional information can be released about the individuals. It is noted, that privacy precludes location information regarding individuals tested to anyone other than Public Health Officials and First Responders.

The Oak Park Department of Public Health is working closely with officials from the Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH), investigating and notifying anyone who may have had exposure to the individual who tested positive for COVID-19. Local public health officials, hospitals and first responders are following protocols consistent with the latest guidance from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC).

**Cases related to Long-Term Care and Assisted Living Facilities**

Interim Public Health Director Terry reported no changes to the Chart below since January 4, 2021.

### Employee Positive

Today, the Village received notification that one (1) Village employee received a positive diagnosis of COVID-19. This employee is a sworn employee in the Fire Department. Because of privacy laws, no additional information can be released. The Village now has had thirty-four (34) confirmed cases of COVID-19 in the workforce.

### State of Illinois Updates

Today Governor JB Pritzker announced that Friday, January 15, will be the first day that a region of the state can have Tier 3 enhanced mitigations removed. Oak Park is in Region 10 and current metrics can be found at the link below:

IDPH tracks the positivity rates and hospital capacity metrics in regions over 14-day monitoring periods to determine if mitigations can be relaxed, if additional mitigations are required, or if current mitigations should remain in place. For Tier 3 mitigation metrics to be relaxed (i.e., move to Tier 2), a region must experience less than 12% test positivity rate (7-day rolling average) for three consecutive days, AND greater than 20% percent available intensive care unit (ICU) and medical/surgical bed availability (3-day rolling average) for three consecutive days, AND decline in the number of COVID-19 patients in the hospital (7-day rolling average) in 7 out of the last 10 days.

The Governor also announced the State's details for 1B vaccinations and this [Phase 1B of the state's vaccination plan \(available via this link\)](#) includes frontline essential workers and residents age 65 and over. The frontline essential workers designation includes many residents who carry a higher risk of COVID-19 exposure because of their work duties, often because they are unable to work from home, and/or they must work closely to others without being able to socially distance.

The Village continues to disseminate vaccine received to local hospitals for health care worker vaccinations. The Village did not receive any allocation of vaccine the week of December 28, 2020. Vaccine allocation has been received this week with the majority the "second" dose tied to the first vaccines which began December 17, 2020. A detail of this week's allocation will be provided on the Village website on Friday, January 8.

### Public Health Data

Interim Public Health Director Terry has shared the following data related to COVID-19.

“New cases per 100,000 People”. This metric looks at the number of recent COVID-19 cases per 100,000 people to describe the potential number of people who are currently ill and may be infectious. This is the number of new cases reported by IDPH in the previous week. Calculated as a rate = [Village of Oak Park case count for 7 days] / [Village population] x100,000.

- Oak Park rate: 203/100,000
- Cook County rate: 284/100,000 (12/20/2020 through 12/26/2020)
- Target for County-level data: Cases for the week are fewer than 10 or the rate is fewer than 50 cases per 100,000 people
- Warning for County-level data: New case rate is greater than 50 cases per 100,000 people

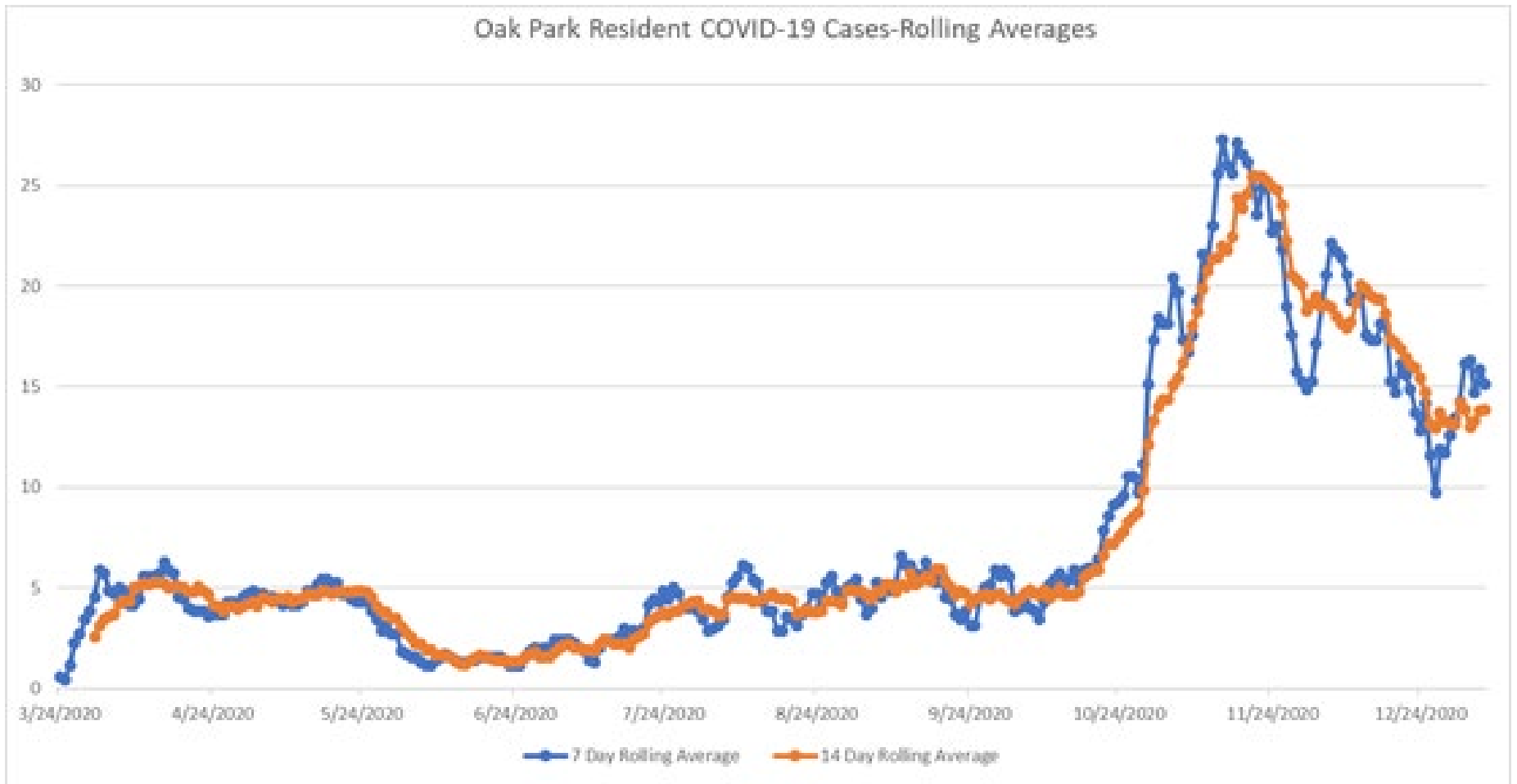

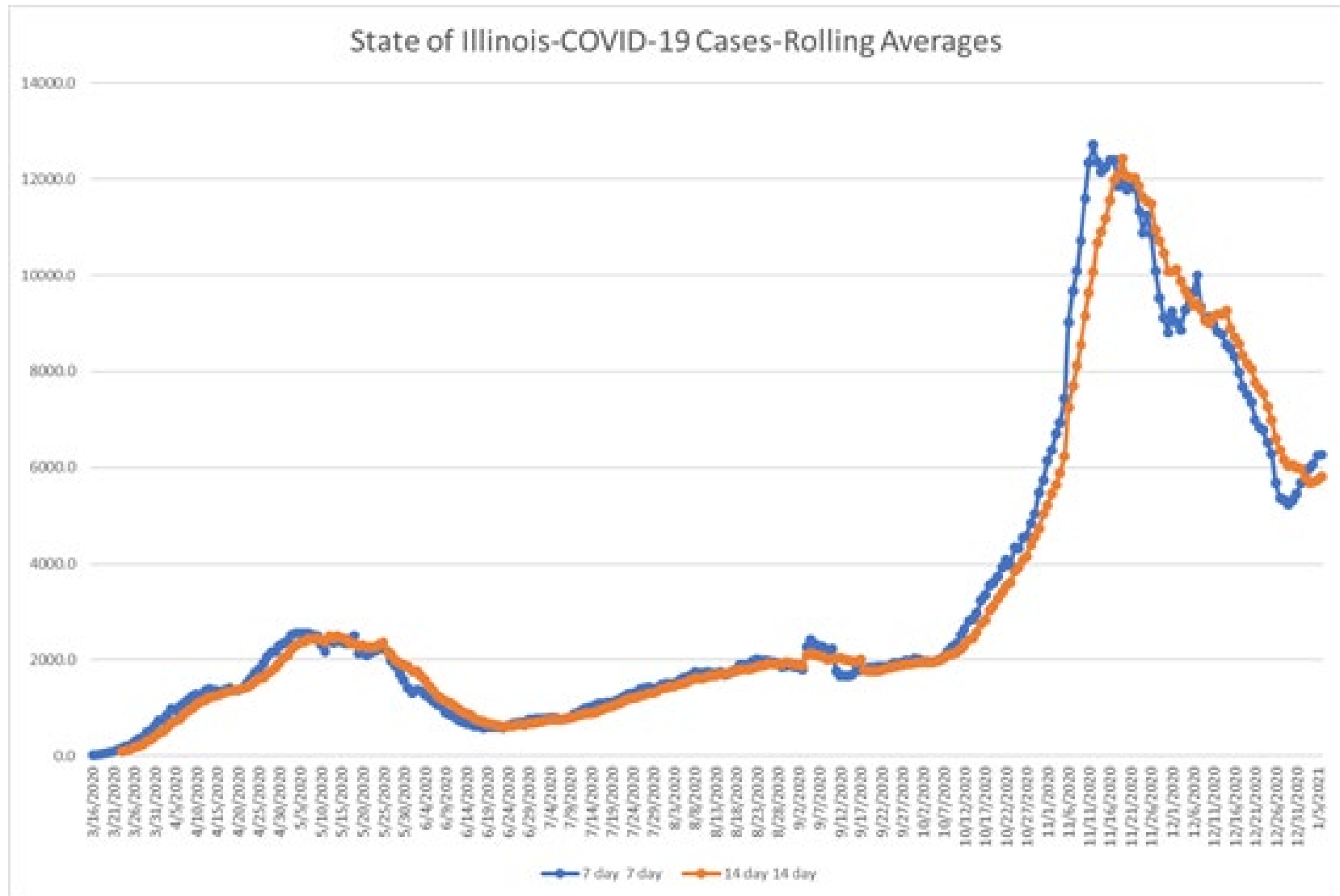
