**NEW BUSINESS:** a. REVIEW OF VOP BOARD GOALS

Discussion also took place regarding increasing the budget for CRC activities. The group talked about various collaborations and partnerships that should be explored as it relates to the workplan. A suggestion that cross-commission

activities should be explored to enhance community engagement and collaboration throughout the community around community safety and partnering with different cultures throughout the Village of Oak Park. There was a discussion on lack of community engagement that should be addressed through developing strategies for promoting more active community/citizen engagement in the face of COVID restrictions. The group agreed that pulling people out into the public for engagement activities will pose a challenge as many are still afraid and cautious regarding safety.
