Motion for a voice votes was made by Comm Terretta and seconded by Comm Sakiyama. A voice vote was taken with all in favor. A question about the CRC's involvement with DIOV for 2022 elicited the response that the CRC will work the Community Relations department to have a table at the DIOV and volunteers will be needed.
